**BACKGROUND** 

On 3 September 2008, as Mayor, I received a deputation from Messrs Derek Brennan of

Ulmarra and Roy Bowling of Tucabia proposing the establishment in proximity to the village of Ulmarra, of a museum and display centre to include large equipment and machinery which was in well preserved condition in various nearby locations. A submission was handed to me that day and a copy is provided in the attachments for Council's information.

The submission asked the Council to consider the proposal with a view to providing an

approval in principle. I undertook to place the matter before the Council. ISSUES

The proposal undoubtedly has merit from a range of perspectives including tourism potential, economic and social benefits and the longer term heritage preservation of equipment and machinery from bygone eras. I am advised that there may be one or more parcels of Crown land east of the village of Ulmarra which could be sourced to locate the centre. Council could play a role in securing a suitable parcel from department

of Lands.

Given Council's fiscal constraints and concerns about long term financial sustainability, it

is probable that Council could not commit funds to such a project. However, it could play

a role in sourcing the land, assisting in preparation of a more detailed proposal and sourcing heritage, tourism, and/or Federal Regional Development Australia funds over

time.

It is acknowledged that it is premature to provide support in principle, and that a more detailed report to Council would be an appropriate next step. This is the purpose of this

Notice of Motion.
