BACKGROUND

As council is aware various State government agencies have regularly been increasing their charges against councils by well over CPI increases or rate pegging limits. A good recent example was the recent increase in valuation fees by the Valuer General's Department by 6.5%

ISSUES

Local government needs to object to such unsustainable fees and charges increases in

the strongest possible terms and put the case that such increases should not be permitted by the New South Wales government to be greater than council's capacity to

increase rates i.e. by the rate pegging limit that the same government imposes on local

government. Council's long term financial sustainability is obviously adversely impacted

by such unwarranted, imposed increases.

The motion proposes submission of an appropriately worded motion to the June 2009

Shires Association of New South Wales state conference.
